| <b>Targets:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Studying how workers travel from their homes to their workplaces in 4 European countries.</li> <li>✓ Studying several policies in favour of sustainable mobility in workplaces which reduce environmental impacts, social exclusion and competitiveness. Priority will be conferred to the most effective policies in each country.</li> <li>✓ Exchanging experiences with trade union representatives where the cooperation is established.</li> <li>✓ Designing proposals for the dissemination of actions in favour of sustainable mobility.</li> <li>✓ Suggesting general guidelines of what a European Sustainable Mobility Policy should be.</li> </ul> | <b>Expected results:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Comparative survey on mobility problems for commuters in Belgium, Germany, Italy and Spain considering environmental issues and social exclusion.</li> <li>✓ Comparative study of sustainable mobility policies taking into account the differences between territories, business structures and timing.</li> <li>✓ Guidelines to support trade union and employers' actions in favour of sustainable and safe access to workplaces.</li> <li>✓ 3 workshops to study and draw conclusions from the previous studies. CCOO will take full responsibility for incomes and expenses related to this project.<br>To finance this project, CCOO will request the grant indicated at the top of this document consisting of 80% of the budget and will contribute the remaining 20%.<br>Partners will receive 100% of their eligible expenses.<br>Gross budget estimate per partner amounts to 13,968 € (to cover expenses related with staff, travelling and subsistence allowances, overheads, etc.).  |
