



## Study (I)

### Workplaces

- Vodafone's HQs:
  - Industrial Estate La Moraleja.
  - Fuencarral (Castellana Norte)

### Number of workers and profile

- Initially 1,300 workers (around 2,700 by late 2010)
- 40% women, 60% men (45/55 in 2010)
- 60% higher education graduates
- Average age: 30 (currently 39)

### Working hours

 Flexible working hours depending on the needs of different departments/shift work (07:40 – 10:00 / 16:00 – 19:30)




## Study (III)

- Generated Mobility
  - Origin of journeys
    - 90% Madrid
    - 10% Madrid Region
    - Means of transport used
    - 80% Private vehicle
    - 20% Public transport
  - Average distance
    - 30 Km.
  - Time used in journeys
    - Rush hours >> 45' / 1 hr. 15'
    - Off peak hours → 20′ / 40′
- Level of satisfaction
  - Low







## Current services (I)

- Entry hours service between Castille square and Vodafone's central offices (downtown Madrid)
  - Rush hour (frequency15')
  - occupation 90-100%
- Entry hours service between Fuencarral railway station and Vodafone's central offices
  - Rush hour (frequency 15')
  - occupation 90-100%




## Current services (II)

- Exit hours service between Vodafone's central offices, Fuencarral railway station and Castille Square
  - Rush hour(frequency 30')
  - occupation 80-90%
- Service connecting Vodafone's central offices
  - 10:00-18:00 (frequency 30')
  - occupation 20-30%
- Continous service between Fuencarral railway station and Castellana Norte
  - (frequency 30') 7:30-19:55
  - occupation 50-70%




## Current services (III)

- Entry hours service between central offices, Fuencarral railway station and Castille Square
  - Rush hour (frequency 30')
  - occupation 70-100%
- Night service between CN-Castille Square and Cibeles (one single service at 00:05)
  - occupation 50%
- (canteen servives were cancelled)


